care/mobility nexus

labour migration

- remittances, better life for children / wellbeing

refugees

- asylum or sanctuary / wellbeing

elite/middling migrants

- career, lifestyle, sunshine / wellbeing





Concepts of CARE care is constitutive of kinship and family life

kinship un-biologicized (Schneider 1984)
family are formed not on the basis of what is given,
but on what is done/exchanged
- the process of becoming relatives

concept of 'kinning' vs fictive' kin (Howell, 2003, pp.468)
Kinship "achieved in & through relationships with others" emphasise performative definition of kinship (Sahlins 2011) kinship ties do not exist a priori, but are negotiated on a daily basis through diverse activities, with care-giving being the most significant of those activities.

Definitions of CARE

[T]he work of looking after the physical, psychological, emotional and developmental needs of one or more people ... [embracing] a range of human experiences and relationships of obligation, trust, loyalty and commitment concerned with the well-being of others. (Kofman and Raghuram, 2009: 3)

5 types of care: emotional and moral support; financial, accommodation, practical and personal (hands on) Finch and Mason (1993)

feminist ethics: care is relational and involves the care of others as well as the self. Care requires Attentiveness-Responsibility Competence Responsiveness (Joan Tronto 1993)







Definition of Transnational Care

family caregiving mediated by dialectic capacity (ability, opportunity), the culturally informed sense of obligation and the negotiated family commitments influenced by broader social and political contexts (Baldassar, Baldock, Widling 2007)

reciprocal and asymmetrical, governed by 'norm of generalised reciprocity'; given and returned at different times and degrees across the life course

Portabilty of care = access to -Mobility


Transnational Social Policy

Mobility:

The different conditions in which family exchange takes place reveal marked social asymmetries in today's global world, in which freedom to move has become the main stratifying factor (Bauman 1998)

An ethics of care argues that countries who employ workers have a responsibility to admit the kin who care for and are cared for by that worker (whether children or disabled or elderly) or to provide the conditions that make meeting these care needs and obligations possible.



Care work, by its nature, is relational and entails responsibilities among actors in these relationships. Because these relationships are both structured by, made possible through, and shaped by their political, social and economic contexts, a thorough accounting of these relationships requires a political process that is as broad as are the relationships themselves. Since no institutions yet exist on the global level that function to allocate overall social and political responsibility, the politics of allocating responsibility must still be largely contained within the nation-state.
