* Defined as a researcher who is either in the final year of their PhD (or equivalent) program or is within five years of having been awarded the degree. The age of the researcher has no bearing on the definition, and career breaks within this period do not count against the total.

The [Worldwide Universities Network](#) (WUN) – of which your university is a member – in collaboration with the [United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network](#) (SDSN) and the [United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization](#) (UNESCO), will hold a series of free virtual workshops, each thematically focused on a UN Sustainable Development Goal. The workshops will bring together early career researchers from all around the world interested in establishing connections to colleagues in their field.

Each workshop will be launched by an internationally distinguished speaker who will provide an overview of the major research opportunities and challenges in the broad topic domain.

Following the introductory speaker, participants will break up into virtual videoconference meeting rooms, which will be self-defined according to their particular area of research interest, so that they can develop their international networks and collaborations.
