Research impact is inherently subjective and as such our values and biases can mean we focus on some types of research impact and neglect others. Is that the same for national research ecosystems? This session will help you to explore the types of impact you prioritise and those you do not and compare that to the variations across the different research ecosystems that WUN member institutions are part of.
