Research Culture: What is it and why does it matter?

Research culture is the environment in which your research takes place. It includes the ways we collaborate and communicate, as well as the behaviours, values, and expectations that shape the research process. It also encompasses the mechanisms by which your work is recognised and rewarded.

This session is designed to help you understand how research culture has an impact and what you can do to positively influence the culture around you. You will also explore how diverse cultures influence cross sector and global collaborations, and the wider implications of workplace culture on your career going forward.

By the end of the session, you should be able to:

- Describe the key aspects of positive research culture and its importance within the research environment.
- Identify actions you can take to improve research culture.
- Outline how diverse research cultures influence cross-sector collaboration and global research partnerships.
- Recognise the significance of positive workplace cultures in shaping your personal and professional development.
